ASHILL FLOWER SHOW JULY 28th

Overall there was a drop in entries this year compared to the 2017 Show. This was mainly due to the weather, with a very cold late winter followed by an exceptionally long dry period.

There were 64 vegetable entries, a drop of 20%. Cookery/Housecraft attracted an entry of 110. This was a slight increase with Flavoured Spirit being a popular new introduction. In the flower section there were 64 entries, a massive 40% drop over the 2017 show. Disappointedly there was a drop of 20% in the Children's Classes with just 20 entries.
